Is it Tax Deductible?



Information for Nurses

Below is a list of suggested tax deductions that may be available to you as a **Nurse**. It should be noted, however, that everyone's situation will be different, and it is recommended that you talk to your accountant about any expenses you wish to claim.

WORK-RELATED EXPENSES

Vehicle and travel

- Cost of attending meetings, seminars and training (incl. meals, accommodation and travel costs, parking fees, tolls, and public transport expenses)
- ✓ Taxis or short-term car hire
- ✓ Travel between primary and secondary workplace
- ✓ Travel from home to place of education and back
- ✓ Travel from workplace to place of education and back

□ Clothing

- ✓ Clothing worn for medical reasons (for example, support stockings)
- ✓ Compulsory uniforms
- Conventional clothing damaged at work
- ✓ Everyday footwear
- ✓ Laundry and dry-cleaning

□ Self-Education

- ✓ Cost of meals (if sleeping away from home)
- ✓ Course fees, textbooks, stationery, photocopying and student union fees
- ✓ Depreciation of computer apportioned for self-education
- ✓ Home office expenses
- ✓ Postage and stationery

□ Other

- ✓ Agency commissions and agency fees
- ✓ Annual practising certificate fees
- ✓ Capital allowances
- ✓ First aid courses

The above work-related expenses are provided that:

- you must have spent the money yourself and weren't reimbursed,
- it must be directly related to earning your income,
- you must have a record to prove it.

ALLOWANCES

You cannot automatically claim a deduction just because received an allowance. It must be shown as a separate amount on your payment summary:

- Motor vehicle
- Stocking
- Telephone
- District

- Travelling
- Shift
- Uniform and maintenance

ADDITIONAL | The following general expenses are also allowable:

- □ Bank charges on work-related or investment accounts
- Donations to registered charities
- □ Income Protection Insurance
- □ Sun protection items
- □ Taxation and accountancy fees
